At the time of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in May 2015, a welcome was extended to the Waldensian Delegate, Massimo Long, from Turin. Massimo is the Deacon working with the Turin congregation of the Waldensian Church, carrying out important work in the social and community fields. He was able to speak to the congregation at Liberton Kirk on May 2015.

From a recent issue of the weekly Waldensian publication, "Riforma", it was also noted that the number of Italian Citizens continuing to send the charitable tax funding of .8 per cent of tax, to the Waldensians Social and Community Work was over 600,000, a very significant number given the small numbers of members of the Waldensian Churches. The funds generated amounted to over 41 million euros, of which one-half is sent to projects for health, education and development in the third world.

Copies of the excellent book, "An Alliance Across the Alps", by Mr. R. D. Kernohan, on the links between Scotland and the Reformed Churches in Italy, are still available. This is a most useful Book, with the full history of the Society and its work since foundation in 1850. The book can be obtained from me at £10 per copy.

The Society records its appreciation of the continuing support of all its members most warmly. Likewise, donations for the ongoing work will be most welcome, and Gift Aid Declarations can be provided to donors who pay U.K. tax.
